

Suggestion For The Host of The Discussion Group:

You will need the following equipment:

- (a) 35mm Filmstrip projector
- (b) Home movie type screen
- (c) Paper & pencil for each guest. Suggestions for their use are outlined in the opening frame of the filmstrip.
- (d) Use a record player with a diamond or sapphire needle (Please do not use children's toy-type record players).

We suggest that the most fun and greatest benefit will occur if there is a lively discussion by the group after the audio-visual presentation.

For purposes of the discussion, you, as host, should act as moderator. You should let the group know in advance that you do not presume to be an "expert" on all of the subject matter. Your primary job as Moderator is to encourage group discussion, getting everyone to participate. Revive the almost lost art of conversation. As a springboard for discussion, you may wish to leave the stripfilm frame of questions on the screen. That will help get discussion started. Once started, you will have only to keep it on the general subject, and make sure everyone has a chance to present their thoughts and ideas. The free exchange of ideas is more important than trying to come to agreement on right answers. Have fun!
